PART 5.A APPLICABLE TO ALL TRANSACTIONS

5.A.1 TITLE AND ADMINISTRATION

Any right and/or interest which is acquired under the terms of this Agreement shall pass directly from Seller to the Government. Company shall make payments under this Agreement from funds advanced by the Government and agreed to be advanced by NIOSH, and not from its own assets. Administration of this Agreement may be transferred, in whole or in part, to NIOSH or its designee(s), and to the extent of such transfer and notice thereof to Seller, Company shall have no further responsibilities hereunder.

5.A.2 FAR 52.252-6 Authorized Deviations in Clauses (Apr 1984)

(a) The use in this solicitation or contract of any Federal Acquisition Regulation (48 CFR Chapter 1) clause with an authorized deviation is indicated by the addition of “(Deviation)” after the date of the clause.

5.A.3 IDENTIFICATION OF EMPLOYEES

Identification of Employees. FAR 52.222-54 Employment Eligibility Verification, which is included in this Agreement, requires the Contractor to use an electronic Employment Eligibility Verification (E-Verify) system designated by the Secretary of Homeland Security to verify the eligibility of: (a) all persons hired during the contract term by the Contractor to perform duties within the United States; and (b) all persons assigned by the Contractor to perform work within the United States on the Federal Contract. The Contractor agrees to incorporate FAR 52.222-54 and the substance of this clause Article 23, in all subcontracts issued under this Agreement.

- (1) This requirement applies to: (i) Commercial or noncommercial services (ii) Construction;
- (2) Has a value of more than \$3,000; and
- (3) Includes work performed in the United States.
